On Sunday, April 19th your 6th grader will have the opportunity to create a personalized, beautiful, silver-plated yad at the 6th Graders & Parents Bar/Bat Mitzvah Brunch from 11:10-1 in Reception Hall 1. The yad project is only for those attending the 4/19 brunch. This will be part of the program that day.


If your child will participate in the 4/19 brunch, please follow these directions:

1. Send in or drop off to Abby Reiken at TIC a check made payable to Temple Israel Center for \$18 to cover part of the fee for this project. Write “yad project” on the note of the check. The Religious School PTA is generously subsidizing the rest of the costs for this project.
2. **BY 3/12** visit <http://www.ArtWithAvi.com/yadmaker>. This will bring up the on-line yad creation system. Your 6th grader will design his/her yad by choosing beads and adding his/her Hebrew name. Fill up the whole space on the yad by clicking the beads you would like to add. You can take one bead off by clicking below on “Remove LAST” and start again by clicking “Remove ALL.” A bead won’t be added at the end if it’s too big, so choose a smaller bead. A little space left over at the end is okay. For more help, click the blue question mark located on the top-right corner of the yad creator. To see examples of completed yads, click on the examples at the bottom of the page.
3. When you are done creating your yad, please enter your English name—both first and last name. Then in the box labeled Project ID, **enter our group’s ID#, which is 110571. Without entering the correct Project ID, we will not be able to order your yad.** When you are sure you are done with your yad, click the Submit button. Abby will have a print out of all the yad designs at the 4/19 brunch.
