Moderator: Jessica Haller, a sustainability and climate leader, is Vice Chair of the Board of Directors at Hazon, a Jewish environmental nonprofit, and has worked on countless initiatives including Hazon's Sustainability Seal program. She has an MPA in environmental science and policy from Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs and the Earth Institute, and is a LEED Accredited Professional with the US Green Building Council and a Climate Reality Project Leader.
